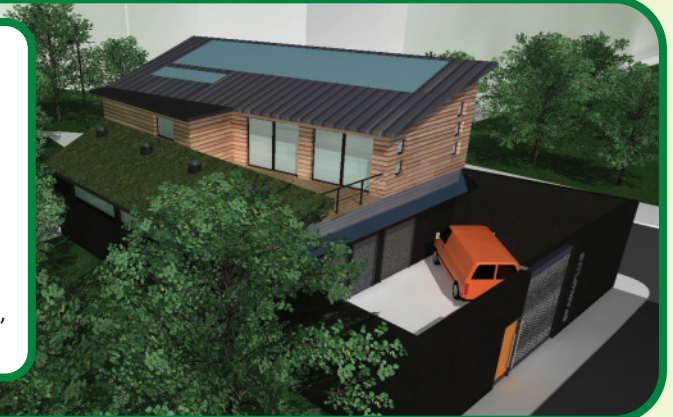

More improvements to Bingfield Park

If you live in the area you will already know that a lot of changes are happening in and around Bingfield Park.

In 2005 the council remodelled the park, improving the appearance and safety of the area; this has greatly increased the use of the park.

Further improvements have taken place over the past year including planting, replacement of the fence along Rufford Street and floodlights for Crumbles Castle Adventure Playground and the ball court.

Funding is now available to develop the council building on the corner of Freeling Street and Pembroke Street. This is a great opportunity to improve this area of the park and provide new facilities for local young people.

The council has been working with the Sparkplug Motorcycle Project, Crumbles Castle Adventure Playground, other local youth service providers and young people to develop a proposal for the site.



The proposed new building provides improved workshops for the Sparkplug Motorcycle Project, a large multipurpose teaching room for training and community use and changing facilities for young people using the ball court in the park.

Now we want to find out what you think of the proposal.

If you can't make it to the meeting but would like to see the proposal, drawings will be on display in Crumbles Castle Adventure Playground and Sparkplug during opening hours from Monday 21 July to Friday 25 July.
